Charlotte Streck is a founding partner and director of Climate Focus, and lead Counsel for Climate Change at the Center for International Sustainable Development Law (CISDL) in Montreal. She is an internationally recognized expert on the law and policy of climate change and emissions trading. She advises on the regulatory framework of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Kyoto Protocol, the European Emissions Trading Scheme, emerging US emissions trading systems, and voluntary carbon standards. She has extensive experience in drafting and negotiating complex carbon agreements, related, among others, to establishing carbon funds, implementing projects, and the contracting intermediaries. She is a former Senior Legal Counsel at the World Bank and has been involved in climate change policy and carbon projects throughout her career. Charlotte is an advisor to numerous governments, private companies, foundations, and non profit organizations both on commercial as well as policy aspects of climate change policy. She has published extensively and serves on several advisory and editorial boards, is an adjunct lecturer at Potsdam University and an advisor to the Prince of Wales Rainforest Project.
